Malbec

This Malbec channels the more elegant side of life; it is subtle, with flavours of strawberry and cherry. Impressively refined and still supported by firm tannins. AVAILABLE IN AB, SK, MB.

FOOD SUGGESTIONS: Empanadas, Indian cuisine, any grilled meat, tacos.



Tannat

Notes of eucalyptus and plenty of dark aromas. The palate is thick but proportioned with ripe tannins with a big punch mid-palate but goes gently down the throat. AVAILABLE IN AB.

FOOD SUGGESTIONS: BBQ and grilled meat, especially beef; can also be matched with lots of spice.



Torrontès

Intense aromas of ripe peaches, flowers and hints of citrus. Medium bodied, lively with an incredible fresh taste. AVAILABLE IN AB, SK.

FOOD SUGGESTIONS: Any kind of Asian cuisine, even if it is spicy, smoked salmon, white meat.

Did u know...

Malbec is called Auxerrois or Côt in France but in Bordeaux it's called Malbec

Malbec has been growing in SW France (eg; Cahors) since the middle ages

Tannat is found in SW France in Cahors, and in Uruguay

Torrontes is only found in Argentina, not to be confused with the same grape variety name in Spain

San Rafael, located in Southern Mendoza, is naturally irrigated by the Diamante and Atuel rivers

Rodolfo is the name of the owner

The **family company** was started in 1870 by José Lavaque who planted the first vines in the Cafayate Valley. Today, it is Rodolfo Félix Lavaque (the namesake for the don Rodolfo wines), the fifth generation Lavaque, who is now continuing the family legacy that encompass some of the finest properties across Mendoza, Cafayate and Salta
